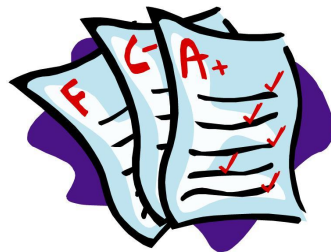

- Daily Practice:

Calendar Talk: 12 months, date, days of week, seasons, weather and special events

Other Topics: colors, shapes, numbers, sizes, polite words and phrases, clothes, etc.

- Reading:

Picture book series "My First Chinese Words" will be read to class throughout the year. In addition, students will practice reading on the stories that are created in class.

- Stories making:

**Question words** that will be used for story asking: who, what, where, or, which, "yes or no" question particle, how.

**High frequency verbs** that will be used:

✧ **Super 7** (am/like/want/there is/have/go/is located)

✧ **Sweet 16 Verbs**

(bring/can/come/give/go/have/hear/is/know/say/want/leave/make/put/like/see)

- Writing:

Continue to learn more radicals, characters and start to practice writing words and phrases.
